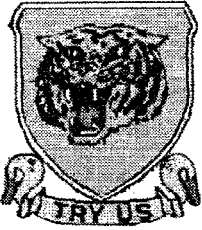

COMMANDER'S COMMENTS:

Friends and families of "New Orleans Own" Washington Artillery,

The month of June has been a very busy time for the battalion. All of the units completed their Convoy Security Missions by June 22, 2010, and the Battalion Headquarters turned over full control of the Operations

Center to the 1-116 Infantry Battalion; the other half of Task Force Overlord. The battalion then began the turn-in process of all of their equipment preparing to transition to their follow-on missions. The Advance Party for each unit was simultaneously sent to the future locations so that they could lay the ground work for success by preparing for each unit's arrival at the impending destination.

By the end of mission in Tallil, the battalion had driven over 50,000 miles; safely delivering millions of dollars of products throughout central and southern Iraq. There was not a single incident in which a convoy lost one of its trucks or its commodities to actions by insurgents. The Soldiers of the Washington Artillery were ever vigilant and operated successfully, completing their missions in that dangerous environment.

The battalion re-task organized at the end of June with each unit being assigned different missions in different locations. This was done as part of our nations responsible draw-down of forces in Iraq. The Battalion Headquarters will be in charge of the Rear Area Operations Center (RAOC) in the International Zone (IZ) near Baghdad. This area was formerly known as the Green Zone. Alpha Battery and Bravo Batteries became a Force Protection Companies that will also work out of the IZ. Golf Company will continue to be a Convoy Security Company working for 3-156 Infantry in Mosul, Iraq.

All of the Soldiers are excited about the impending moves and changes of mission. It will come at a perfect time being in the middle of our tour thus providing a change of venue and mission. Conducting this type of mission mid-stride is never easy. There was a lot of in-depth planning done at the battalion and battery levels. There was also a lot of coordination that had to occur in order to secure flights for our Soldiers and transportation for our equipment. The synchronization of all of these moving pieces was difficult because in many cases the equipment was still being utilized up until the shipping date.

The Soldiers are most excited about the impending change of mission because they will be moving out of the desert. There are trees and water at each of the locations that we will be working; what a big change. The new locations also offer relief from the daily dust storms and sweltering temperatures of Tallil. In most cases the temperatures are ten to fifteen degrees cooler. The reports from each unit's advance party are that the living conditions for each Soldier are also much improved.

Morale remains high among the Soldiers with many of them having been on leave or having scheduled their leave. There is a lot of work to be done ahead; changing missions is never easy. It takes a couple of weeks to establish your productive routines or battle rhythm. I know that the Soldiers of the Washington Artillery will be successful and set the standard for professionalism and dedication at their new locations. I am honored to have the privilege to command the finest Soldiers in the United States Army.
